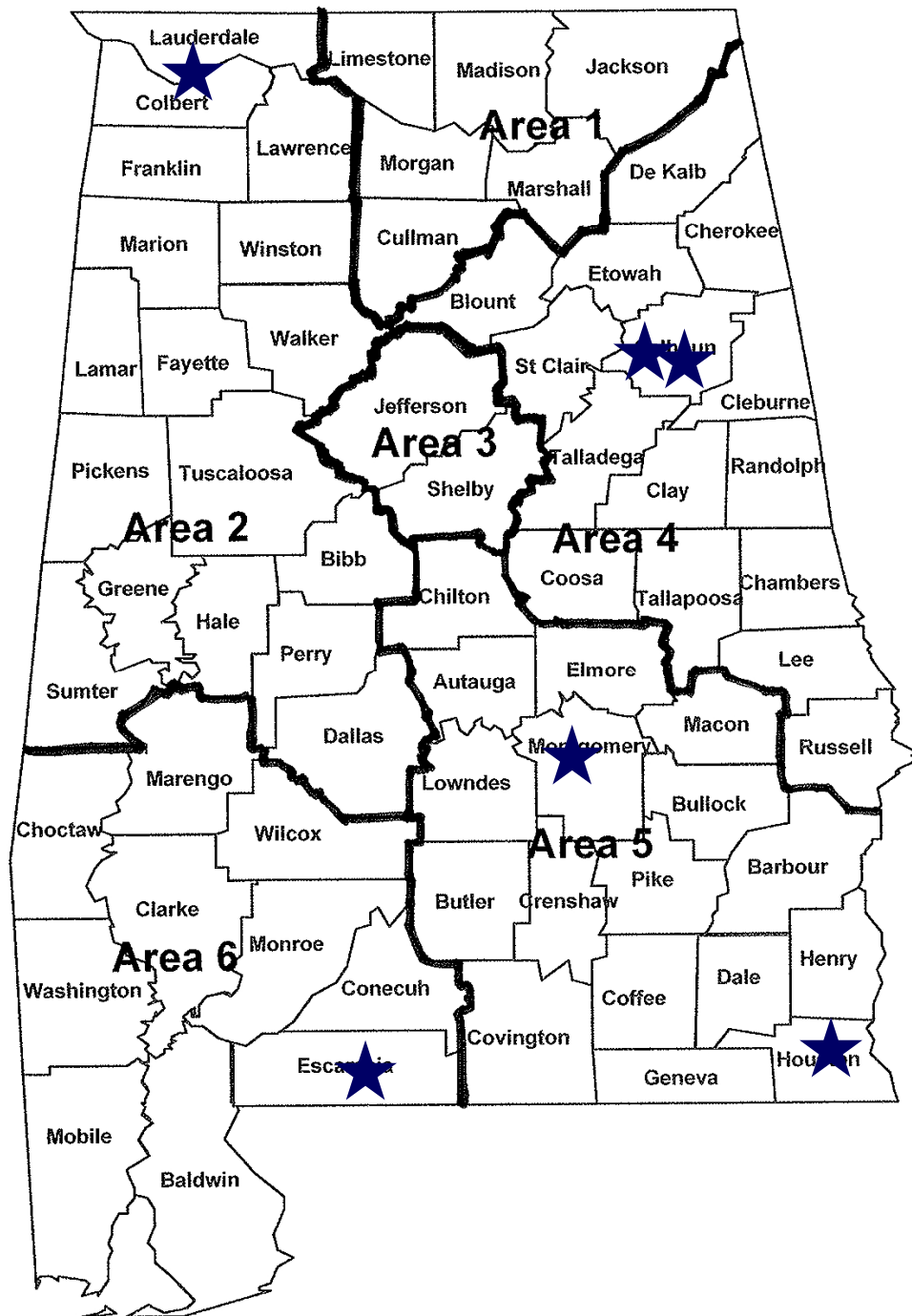

<p>Practice overview Dothan Pediatric Clinic was established in 1953. We currently have twelve Board Certified Pediatricians, six nurse practitioners, and 100 support staff. We have four satellite locations; Dothan, Enterprise, Ozark and Eufaula. Our office hours are Monday-Friday 8:00 until 5:00, Saturday 8:00 until 11:00 and Sunday 1:00 until 4:00. Our patient population is made up of 47% Alabama Medicaid, 45% Blue Cross Blue Shield, 3% other insurance and the remainder private pay. Our clinic utilizes full electronic medical records. We also have a full time pediatric neurologist on staff located in a second office in Dothan</p>

<p>Practice overview We are a six-pediatrician group with three nurse practitioners. We see a wide variety of patients from southern TN, NE Mississippi and seven counties of NW Alabama. Our practice is 40 percent Medicaid and 45 percent Blue Cross Blue Shield.</p>			
<p>Specifics of rotation Six pediatricians and three nurse practitioners in a large group practice covering several NW Alabama counties as well as Southern TN and NE Mississippi. Payer mix is 45% Medicaid, 55% private insured. The resident would live in one of the physician's lake homes for a two- or four-week elective. The first week would be spent shadowing the physicians, with the following weeks spent on a supervised schedule. The resident would present to the provider staff topics of interest for 30 minutes over lunch twice each week of the rotation. The resident would be expected to be available for nursery and hospital rounds with our physician staff.</p>

Dear Practicing Pediatrician:

A number of years ago, the Alabama Chapter-AAP Young Pediatricians Committee put together a compendium of practices willing to host resident elective rotations across the state. These information sheets provide the residents with contact information, practice overviews and what the practices could provide as far as meals and housing. The electives could be for one, two or four weeks, and residents would be covered by their program's malpractice insurance. If interested, please complete all of the fields below, including times of year interested and how many residents could be accommodated during a year. We will update these yearly.

EXAMPLE OF TYPE OF INFORMATION NEEDED: Alabama Pediatrics, four doctors and one NP in rural Alabama, serves a population 50% Medicaid and 50% Blue Cross. One of our physicians would provide lodging at a lake house; meals covered by our local hospital. We would accept one resident in fall and one in spring for either two- or four-week rotations. The first few days of a rotation would be spent shadowing different physicians, with the rest of the rotation spent having a limited schedule of patients and checking out with an attending on site. Participation in inpatient and nursery rounds would be expected. For two days of each week spent on rotation, the resident would lead a 30-minute discussion on a primary care issue of interest, primarily drawn from patients seen that week.
