

The Federal HIPAA Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information, or Privacy Rule, address the disclosure and use of individuals' protected health information. The Privacy Rule permits a Covered Entity to disclose protected health information for the purposes of treatment, payment, and health care operations, including care coordination. A Covered Entity refers to a health plan, health care provider, or health care clearinghouse.

Thus, it is permissible for a child health care provider, a Covered Entity, to share a child's screening results with Help Me Grow (HMG) for the purposes of supporting care coordination activities. Upon requesting and securing permission from the family, it is also permissible for a HMG centralized access point (which is not a Covered Entity) to collect and store information about children and families for the purposes of supporting subsequent care coordination and follow-up activities. In addition, with consent from the family, information such as screening results or a list of services and programs to which children were referred can also be shared with the child's healthcare provider.
